# FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS SMITH COUNTY OFFICIAL PUBLIC RECORDS

#### 1. Forms

• We have forms available for Unincorporated Assumed Names and Cattle Brands that you may download, located on our web page under Online Forms.

# 2. Legal advice

• It is unlawful for our Deputy Clerks to administer legal advice. We cannot advise what, when, where, or how you should file an instrument. Please see Texas Gov't Code Sec 81.101.

### 3. On-line Instrument Availability

• Most of our instruments are available on-line at <a href="https://smith.tx.publicsearch.us">https://smith.tx.publicsearch.us</a>. You may print the instrument from home, or you may come to our office to search, and our Deputy Clerks will print a copy for you. We have 4 public use computers that you may access from 8:00 am - 5:00 pm, Monday - Friday.

## 4. Searching for Instruments

• It is unlawful for our Deputy Clerks to conduct a search of the Official Public Records for instruments, per AG Opinion WW-607. We have 4 public use computers that you may access from 8:00 am – 5:00 pm, Monday – Friday, or you may search our web site at <a href="https://smith.tx.publicsearch.us">https://smith.tx.publicsearch.us</a>.

# 5. Cost for Recordation of Instrument

• The fee for recording an instrument is \$25 for the first page, and \$4 for each additional page. Recording on the back of a page is an additional page fee. Indexing over 5 names is .25 cents per name. Specialty instrument fees vary, please see our Recording Fee Schedule for more details.

## 6. Notary Services

• Our Deputy Clerks can notarize your Assumed Name only with proper I.D. We cannot notarize real property records.

### 7. Return of Original Instrument

• When recorded in office you will receive your properly filed instrument after recordation. Mailed instruments are typically recorded the day received and returned in the next mail run. We require a self-addressed and stamped envelope to be included with your filing.

#### 8. Foreclosures

• Foreclosures are posted on our web page and at the Courthouse when received.

### 9. Redaction of Sensitive Information

• You may request removal of all but the last 4 digits of your Social Security number on a filed document in our Official Public Records only. See the Request Form on the first page of the County Clerk's web site.
